FIM ROAD SAFETY AWARD

GENERAL INFORMATION



The Fédération Internationale de Motocyclisme (FIM) is pleased to call for nominations for its Annual Road Safety Award. 2019 sees the tenth edition of this award which was instituted as part of the FIM's contribution to the United Nations Decade of Action for Road Safety. Naturally the award is focused on improving road safety for riders of powered two wheelers - motorcycles, scooters and mopeds.

ELIGIBILITY

The FIM Road Safety Award may be conferred on an individual, a club, a national federation, a governmental organisation, a non-governmental organisation, or a commercial entity.

The history of this award illustrates this scope well:

2010: Greig Craft and the AIP Foundation for low cost motorcycle safety helmets in middle and low income countries.

2011: Andrés Perez Rubio, former motorcycle racing champion, for his work for road safety, in particular barrier safety on the streets.

2012: Ian Burrell MBE and the Ambulance Motorcycle Club of the UK for the helmet medical card (now more than a million distributed worldwide)

2013: The United Kingdom Department for Transport for the SHARP star rating system of independent testing of helmets - modelled on the star rating system for cars.

2014: The KNMV (Royal Dutch Motorcycle Federation) for their work in developing scientifically proven risk awareness training for road riders.

2015: Mr Tony Rich a patrol officer in the AA for his concept for a cycle and motorcycle "awareness" programme directed at drivers. This has become an international campaign promoted by FIA Region One.

2016: Federazione Motociclista Italiana (FMI) for its programme of Road Safety Training.

2017: The Norwegian Motorcycle Union NMCU for their work on the rider training manual Full Kontroll.

2018: Michael Woodford MBE and the Safer Roads Foundation for their work in promoting, "automatic headlights on" technology to be fitted to all motorcycles sold across the world - not just those marketed in Europe and North America. Also, for their advocacy to the motorcycle industry to fit all motorcycles with an anti-lock braking system.

AWARD PRESENTATION

This takes place at the annual FIM Awards Prize Giving Ceremony.

NOMINATIONS

These may be made by an individual, or by an individual acting on behalf of an organisation (for example a FIM FMN). To present a nomination to the FIM for the Road Safety Award, you should:

- Send all documentation in English only
- Describe the individual or organisation you wish to present
- Briefly explain how their work contributes to improving road safety for riders
- Include your contact details in case the judges or the FIM Administration have any further inquiries to make concerning the nomination.

FIM WOMEN IN MOTORCYCLING AWARD



GENERAL INFORMATION

WHY AN AWARD?

With its Women in Motorcycling Award, the Fédération Internationale de Motocyclisme (FIM) wishes to recognise and celebrate those who have significantly:

- **Contributed** to improving and developing the presence of women in all motorcycling-related areas
- **Encouraged** greater awareness of women in motorcycling

The FIM is therefore pleased to call for nominations for this annual FIM Women in Motorcycling Award.

WHO CAN APPLY?

This Award may be conferred on **individuals, groups or organisations** (e.g. CONUs, FMNs, clubs, organisers, promoters, circuit owners, manufacturers, teams etc.) who have made a significant contribution to enhancing awareness of women in motorcycling or who have implemented projects/initiatives to improve the presence of women in all motorcycling-related activities.

These projects, initiatives or contributions can be related to **sporting or non-sporting** activities and should be in alignment with FIM Advancing Women in Motorcycling Programme. They should provide **mid- or long- term solutions** to help develop the presence of women in all motorcycling-related activities and have lasting effects and impacts on the awareness of women in motorcycling.

PRACTICALLY

The award may be granted for a single project, activity or initiative over the period **1 September 2018 to 31 August 2019**. Nominations may be submitted by an FMN, the person(s) involved in the activity or by a third party. Please note that FIM Staff and CFM members cannot be nominated for this Award.

Example of initiatives in line with the FIM Advancing Women in Motorcycling Programme and eligible for the FIM Women in Motorcycling Award:

- Covering women's activities and achievements in the media in an effective manner
- Suggesting simple and effective ideas to encourage greater participation by women in all FIM's activities
- Providing competitive opportunities for women at national, continental or international level (from grass root to senior level)
- Promoting female role models and developing mentoring programs
- Etc.

In concrete terms:

- Increasing the sporting level of female competitors in all disciplines
- Creation of new competitions/classes for women
- Increasing the number of female volunteers, officials, referees etc.
- Organisation of training camps or seminars for female riders or officials



- Innovations from industry/manufacturers dedicated to women
- Safety work focusing on women
- Etc.

SENDING A CANDIDATURE

Candidatures must be in **English only** and should be submitted as soon as possible, the final deadline being **31 August 2019**.

In order to send their candidatures, candidates must use the dedicated online application form by clicking [HERE](#)

Candidates can, if they wish, send additional supporting documents (i.e. selection of pictures or videos, reference letters, relevant press release...) directly by email to awards@fim.ch.

The FIM reserves its right not to award the prize if no suitable candidatures are received.

THE JURY

All candidatures will be examined by an **independent jury** composed of a Member of the FIM Awards and Recognition Board Committee, the CFM Director, the FIM Women's Legend of the previous year (2018) and two independent experts appointed by the FIM. The Jury will first shortlist the **three best candidatures** - which will be published on the FIM website and Facebook pages. The Jury will then choose the winner from among those three candidatures.

Any conflicts of interest must be declared at the beginning of the process.

RECEIVING THE AWARD

The awardee will be invited to the annual FIM Awards Prize Giving Ceremony and will receive the award on stage. The awardee will have the privilege to use the FIM Women in Motorcycling Award **logo** on all its related communications (print, web etc.).

We encourage our CONUs, FMNs and Commission Directors and Members to share with us potential candidates for the FIM Women in Motorcycling Award.

FIM ENVIRONMENTAL AWARD

GENERAL INFORMATION



The Fédération Internationale de Motocyclisme (FIM) is pleased to call for nominations for its annual **Environmental Award**. Through this award, the FIM wishes to recognise and show its appreciation for those who have significantly contributed to the **preservation and protection of the environment**, and to encourage a **greater awareness of environmental concerns**.

ELIGIBILITY

The Award may be conferred on **individuals, groups or organisations** (e.g. FMNs, Clubs, Organisers, Circuit Owners, Manufacturers, teams, etc.) that have made a significant contribution to enhancing environmental awareness and environmentally responsible behaviour by:

- **Organising** events in the field of motorcycling world (sport or touristic) that are sustainable from an environmental, social and/or economic point of view
- **Promoting, publicising or supporting** significantly the Ride Green Programme
- **Developing** a project or programme that contributes to enhancing the sustainable practice of motorcycling.

It may be granted for a single project or for activity over the period **September 2018 through August 2019**. Nominations may be submitted by an FMN (compulsory for clubs, organisers & teams), person(s) involved in the activity, or by a third party. FIM Staff and CID Members may not be nominated for the Award.

Following the FIM environmental sustainability policy, the entry must show:

- That the organisation has inspired people through motorcycle sport to change their behaviour long-term in support of reducing or minimising negative impacts on the natural environment;

and/or

- That the organisation has taken action itself through motorcycle sport to create a positive impact on the natural environment.
- That an environmental improvement has been made or environmental awareness has been raised in a measurable way as a result of the entrant's actions.

SCOPE OF THE AWARD

Examples of sustainable programmes, events, campaigns that may be eligible include, but are not limited to:

- Pollution prevention/recycling/green purchasing
- Projects or programmes addressing environmental and social issues through sport
- Reductions in greenhouse gas emissions
- Waste management in mega events
- Generation or development of alternative energy
- Environmental Management Systems at events



- Environmental education
- Sound-level reduction
- Fans' engagement
- Any other innovative environmental enhancement ideas or programmes
- Contribution to the achievement of the UN Sustainable Development Goals

JURY

All nominations will be evaluated by an independent Jury (composed by the Chairman of the FIM Awards and Recognition Board Committee or a person designated by him/her, the CID Director and three independent Experts in the field of sustainability chosen by the FIM who must declare any conflict of interest at the beginning of the process).

AWARD PRESENTATION

The winner will be invited on stage during the annual FIM Awards Prize Giving Ceremony.

The FIM reserves its right not to award the prize, should no candidature be in accordance with the present provisions.

In order to encourage an awareness of the concept of Fair Play, the FIM created this Trophy to reward a significant act of fair play in motorcycling sport. This distinction, conferred on twelve occasions since 1986, is awarded to individuals, riders, teams, FMNs, Clubs, spectators, organisers or firms that have displayed a great sense of fair play.

ELIGIBILITY

This distinction is awarded to individuals, riders, teams, FMNs, Clubs, spectators, organisers or firms that have displayed a great sense of fair play.

JURY

The FIM Awards and Recognition Committee.

TROPHY PRESENTATION

This takes place at the annual FIM Awards Prize Giving Ceremony.

NOMINATIONS

These may be made by an individual, or by an individual acting on behalf of an organisation (for example a FIM FMN).

National Motorcycling Federations (FMN) are kindly invited to also draw the attention of those involved in their country to this Trophy.

Please find below the [details on how to present a nomination](#) to the FIM for the FIM Fair Play Trophy:

- Documentation should be sent **exclusively in English**.
- Include your contact details in case the FIM Awards and Recognition Committee Members/Administration have any further inquiries to make concerning the nomination.
- Describe the individual or organisation you wish to nominate.
- Briefly explain the context and how their behaviour is remarkable and why you believe it deserves such recognition.
- If you wish you can also give details of any referees who are willing to give their support to your nomination (Or you can include references with your nomination).



- You may also send supporting documentation. For example, video, details of other awards that have been made for the behaviour concerned and/or press and media coverage of the event.

The FIM reserves its right not to award the prize, should no candidature be in accordance with the present provisions.

These projects, initiatives or contributions can be related to **sporting or non-sporting** activities and should be in alignment with FIM Development Programmes. They should provide **mid- or long- term solutions** to help develop the presence of youngsters in all motorcycling-related activities and have lasting effects and impacts on the awareness of youngsters.

PRACTICALLY

The award may be granted for a single project, activity or initiative over the period **September 2018 to August 2019**. Nominations may be submitted by an FMN, the person(s) involved in the activity or by a third party. Please note that FIM Staff members and/or FIM Commissions members cannot be nominated for this Award.
