## 1. Entry procedure / General information

Please note that the entry form has been published on the FIM Website from where it must be downloaded and completed electronically in capital letters:

Each FMN can enter a maximum of two Teams of three riders each in the FIM SuperMoto of Nations:

- One National Team
- One Junior Team  
(the riders of the Junior Team must be under 21 years old / riders born between 1<sup>st</sup> January 1989 and 31<sup>st</sup> December 1995).

Any rider participating in the FIM SuperMoto of Nations must be holder of:

- a passport of the country he represents
- a FIM SuperMoto World Championship licence / Licence valid for the entire year or for one FIM meeting issued by any FMN.

To be eligible for participation in the 2010 FIM SuperMoto of Nations and in order to obtain a FIM Licence for the first time during the current year, the riders must personally sign the "Acknowledgment and Agreement of the FIM Anti-Doping Code" form.

All forms from under-age applicants must be counter-signed by their legal guardians.

It is the task of the FMNs to implement the collection of the aforesaid "Acknowledgement and Agreement of the FIM Anti-Doping Code" forms. Please follow this link to download it:

Riders who already hold a 2010 FIM SuperMoto World Championship licence and have completed and signed an "Acknowledgement and Agreement of the FIM Anti-Doping Code" form this year do not have to complete and sign one again.

Please note that the rider should always have with him a copy of his "Acknowledgement and Agreement of the FIM Anti-Doping Code", which has been certified by his FMN. We suggest that he keeps this copy with his FIM licence.

**Entries for the 2010 FIM SuperMoto of Nations must be made before the closing date of entries: 31 August 2010.**

Entries must be made by means of the official entry form. This entry form must always be signed by the riders. Moreover, it must be approved by the FMN of each rider. Consequently, the entry form must bear the stamp(s) of the FMN(s) concerned.



Please make sure that you complete all the compulsory fields. Do not forget to mention a contact person for the Team together with email and telephone details.

When completing the entry form, please note that the order in which you present your riders will automatically place them in the corresponding class and Qualifying Group (Rider 1, rider 2, rider 3).

Please note that **motorcycles of the S1 class only** are authorised.

Once the entry form has been duly completed as requested, it must be sent to the FIM as soon as possible:

We understand that in some cases this may be a somewhat lengthy procedure. Therefore, we suggest that you already make a provisional entry by e-mail or fax before the closing date of entries of the meeting.

This provisional entry must then be confirmed by forwarding us the duly completed and approved official entry form.

A provisional entry should provide the following information on the Team:

**A. For each rider:**

- Qualifying Group (Rider 1, rider 2 or rider 3).
- Name and first name
- Date of birth
- Nationality
- FMN that issued the FIM SuperMoto World Championship licence
- FIM licence number (if already known)
- Motorcycle (S1 Class)

**B. For the Team Manager:**

- Name and first name

Teams/Riders may be required to sign an individual entry form during the administration control if necessary.

## 4. FIM Logo, number plates and starting numbers

We would also like to inform you about the FIM "SuperMoto of Nations" logo, which must be displayed on the leathers/bibs and the motorcycles (front number plate).

Please note that the logos are in black or white. If the logo is reproduced in black, a white background/box must be respected. If the logo is reproduced in white, a black background/box must be respected.

A copy of the FIM "SuperMoto of Nations" logo is attached to this letter. However, the logo is also available from YouthStream. Please contact YouthStream/Mr Marc Pauwels: [sportoffice@youthstream.org](mailto:sportoffice@youthstream.org).

As for the colours displayed on the motorcycle's front number plate:

- A. - For the winning Team of the previous year's FIM SuperMoto of Nations  
All 3 riders            Red background            White numbers/FIM logo
- B. - For the other Teams  
All 3 riders            Background: free            Numbers: Free + FIM logo  
(For the logo: see §2 here above)

For all the Teams, the motorcycle's side number plates must always display:

- The Team's national flag, respecting the dimensions of the number plate, as well as the starting number of the rider.



The riders of each Team are required to wear a uniform "Team bib". This bib must display the country's and rider's names and starting number. The Team's sponsors may also be displayed on this bib. A drawing of the bib (front and back side) is added to this file.

We would also like to inform you that Golden Tyre has been appointed Official Supplier for tyres by YouthStream for the 2010 FIM SuperMoto of Nations.

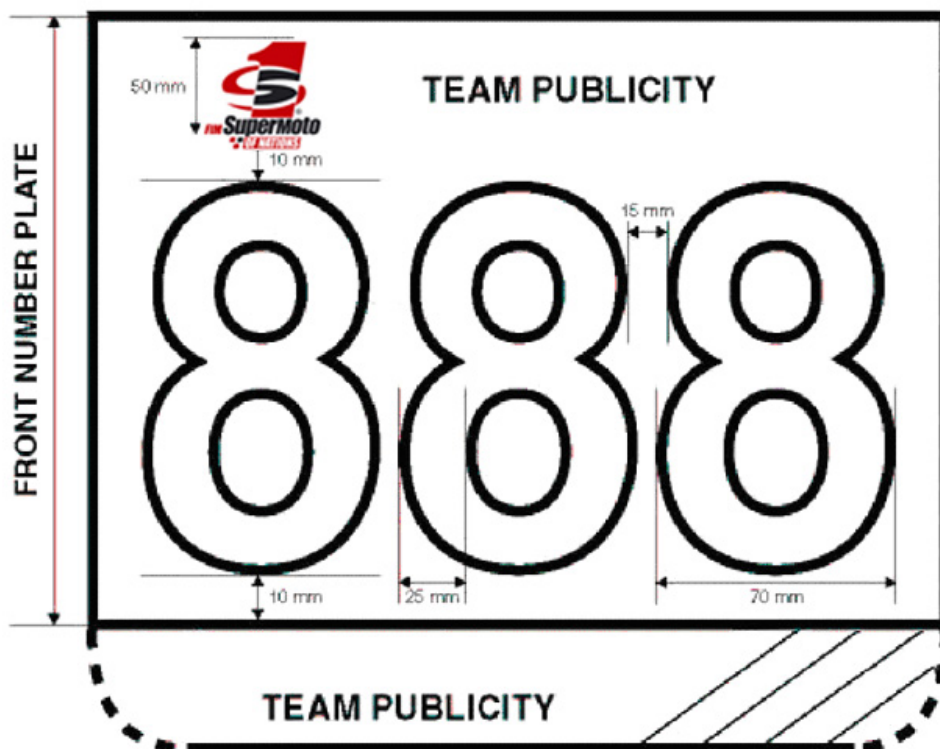

## Front Number Plate

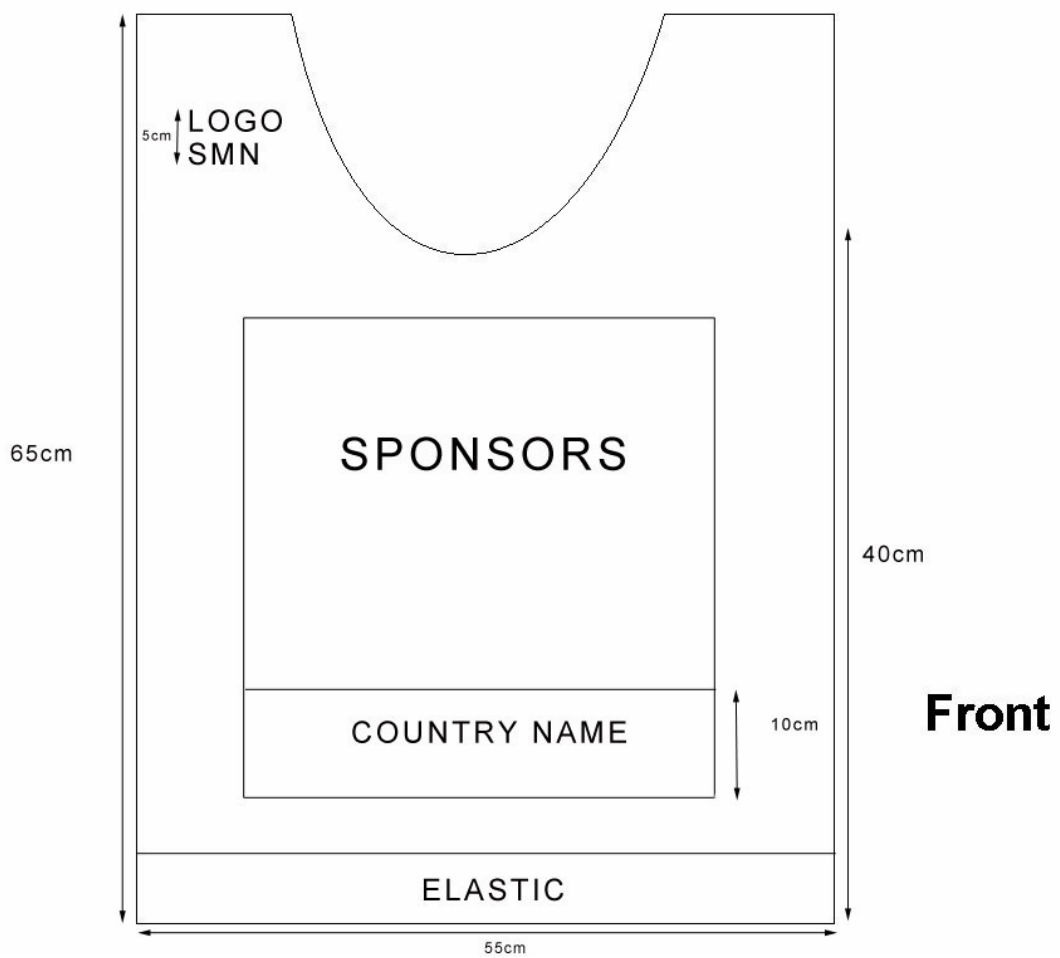

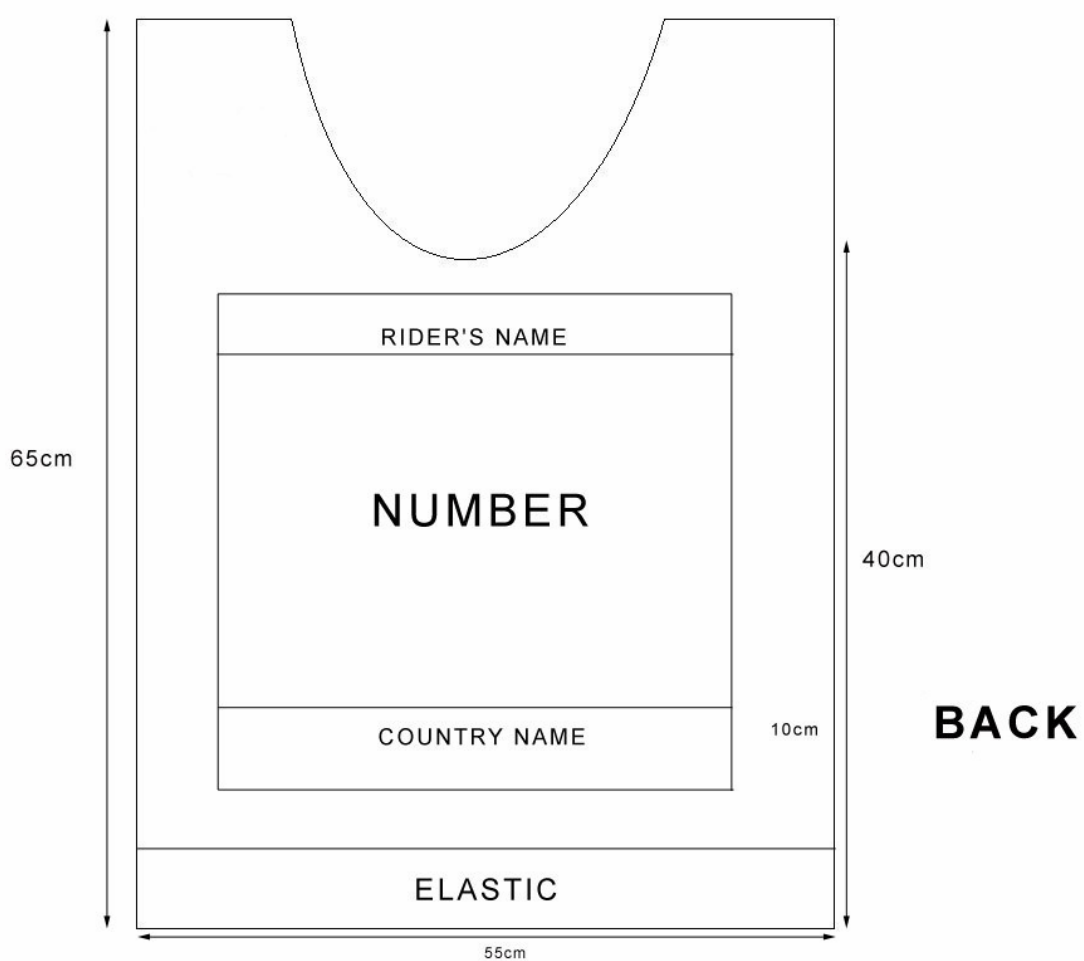
