The FIM is delighted to announce the 2020 FIM E-Bike Enduro World Cup & EX-Bike World Cup calendars, its innovative competition for electric powered cycles launched in 2019.

2 Categories:

- **Enduro1 (E1):** E-Bike equipped with a motor with a maximum continuous rated power of 250W and whose assistance does not exceed 25 km/h. Its minimum weight is 18 kg and 26 kg maximum
- **Enduro2 (E2):** E-Bike equipped with a motor with a maximum rated continuous power of 500W and whose assistance can exceed 25 km/h but does not exceed 45 km/h. Its minimum weight is 18 kg and 32 kg maximum.

Due to the ongoing restrictions put in place by the German government regarding the Coronavirus disease (COVID-19) pandemic, which includes no mass sporting events until the end of August, FIM E-Bike Enduro World Cup set to take place on 21 June in Alfsee is cancelled.

6 FIM Classes:

- FIM EX 1 World Cup
- FIM EX 2 and EX Proto World Cup
- FIM EX 1W World Cup, for riders (WOMEN)
- FIM EX 2W and EX ProtoW World Cup (WOMEN)

3 Categories:

- **EX 1:** E-Bike equipped with a motor with a maximum continuous rated power of 250W and whose assistance does not exceed 25 km/h. Its minimum weight is 18 kg and 26 kg maximum
- **EX 2:** E-Bike equipped with a motor with a maximum rated continuous power of 500W and whose assistance can exceed 25 km/h but does not exceed 45 km/h. Its minimum weight is 18 kg and 32 kg maximum.
- **EX Proto:** E-Bike equipped with a motor with a maximum rated continuous power over 500W, less than 5000W and whose assistance can exceed 25 km/h but does not exceed 45 km/h. Its minimum weight is 32 kg and 60 kg maximum

The FIM (Fédération Internationale de Motocyclisme) founded in 1904, is the governing body for motorcycle sport and the global advocate for motorcycling. The FIM is an independent association formed by 112 National Federations throughout the world. It is recognised as the sole competent authority in motorcycle sport by the International Olympic Committee (IOC). Among its 50 FIM World Championships the main events are MotoGP, Superbike, Endurance, Motocross, Supercross, Trial, Enduro, Cross-Country Rallies and Speedway. Furthermore, the FIM is also active and involved in the following areas: public affairs, road safety, touring and protection of the environment. The FIM was the first international sports federation to impose an Environmental Code in 1994.
